Hounslow Highways attends careers expo

Hounslow Highways took part in the 'Aspire' careers expo at West Thames College on Friday, 4 April.

It is West London's biggest jobs and careers event that brings together top employers with job and apprenticeship vacancies and careers advice.

Hounslow Highways Business Manager Tim Hurley, Communications Officer Alice Campion, Customer Service Unit assistant Ata Rahman and HR Business Partner Nayna Patel attended the event and set up a display, offering the latest information on the Apprenticeship Programme within Hounslow Highways.

Hounslow Highways offers apprenticeships in Highway Maintenance, Environmental Services and Business Administration.

There are currently four apprentice positions available for young people interested in gaining an NVQ Level 3 in Business Administration and manypeople registered their interest on the day. These apprentices will be recruited in early May.

The event, organised by Mary Macleod MP, expected 1,600 people through the doors and 60 businesses to exhibit.

Hounslow Highways Service Director Rob Gillespie said: "These local events are a great way to get involved in the local community and get the message out that we are keen to employ people locally and stimulate the economy in Hounslow."



Looking for lay assessors

Hounslow Highways has been receiving expressions of interest from residents to become volunteer lay assessors.

The aim is to recruit 20 volunteers — one from each ward across the borough — to independently and objectively assess Hounslow Highways' work and services.

The lay assessors will also help us understand residents' perception of the highways network and be ambassadors for the borough's roads.

They will look at different aspects of the service, including safety, quality, accessibility, customer care, environmental impact and good working practices.

The deadline for expressions of interest has been extended to Thursday, 24 April 2014.

An information and induction session will then be held after the Easter break.

Training will include meet and greet sessions with our teams and site supervisors so lay assessors and crews are familiar with each other when audits are undertaken.

Highways FPNs issued

Hounslow Highways has now issued 71 fixed penalty notices relating to offences committed on the public highway. Fifty-eight relate to skips and 13 were issued as a result of offences involving hoarding, scaffolding and building materials.

Infrared cameras to catch fly-tippers around the clock

Hounslow Highways, in partnership with Hounslow Council, has installed new infrared enforcement cameras around the borough to catch fly tippers no matter what time of day it is

Most of the borough's fly tipping happens overnight, making it difficult to catch offenders. However the three infrared enforcement cameras record in darkness to provide around the-clock surveillance.

They are in addition to the three CCTV cameras installed around the borough last month.

Hounslow Highways Service Director Rob Gillespie said: "The infrared cameras will allow us to pursue fly tipping cases where we previously have not been able to due to lack of evidence. Fly tipping is illegal and last year alone we cleared more than 3,000 fly tips. It costs about £3 million to clean the borough each year and some of that money and resources used to clear fly-tips could be used for other services.

"These cameras are a reminder to those who fly tip that if they are caught they will be fined."

Fly tipping is an offence under the Environmental Protection Act and carries a penalty of up to £50,000 and/or a prison sentence.

73 enviro-crime FPNs issued

Hounslow Highways has now issued a total of 73 fixed penalty notices to Hounslow residents and businesses. Sixty-five have been issued for littering and eight have been issued for incorrectly placing commercial waste on the public highway.

These fines have been issued by Hounslow Highways Community Environment Officers independently and in conjunction with the local police.

To further emphasise the 'zero tolerance' approach, Hounslow Highways has installed 'Keep Your Borough Clean' signs around the borough warning that people who litter will be fined £80 if caught, and up to £2,500 in a magistrate's court.

Hounslow Highways Service Director Rob Gillespie said: "These new signs are another step in our efforts to deter people from littering the borough's streets. With the council, we are committed to improving litter levels across Hounslow."

UPDATE: Road closure at Hatton Road/ Staines Road

The road closure at the junction of Hatton Road and Staines Road is now expected to remain in place until the first week of May 2014.

The closure is due to the collapse of a foul sewer on 2 January 2014, resulting in a large hole in the carriageway.

Due to the extent of the works, Thames Water's contractors, Cappagh, require a further six weeks for completion. This is due to the replacement of a 1.5-metre sewer pipe, an ongoing issue with the ground water and services.

To complete the works Thames Water has ordered a special pipe from overseas. Thames Water has apologised for any inconvenience that may be caused during the course of the works and is endeavouring to keep any noise and disruption to a minimum.

A Hounslow Highways inspector will continue to monitor the site to ensure that the work is completed as soon as possible.




How did we do in your area last month?

Hounslow Highways received a total of 2720 enquiries in the month of March, which is an increase of 0.25% from the previous month.


The Chiswick area received 19% of the total with the hub processing 526 enquiries for the month. This is 19% more than the number received in February.

The graph below highlights the breakdown of the service area the complaints were received for. Cleansing complaints received the highest number of reports.



Cleansing and 'other' services received the highest number of enquiries. 'Other' services include enquiries received for issues concerning crossover applications, customer care, footway and verges, grounds maintenance, gullies/pipes and Public Rights of Way.
